A Word From the Pastor

In the bedroom of the parsonage, there is a quote from Theodore Roosevelt on a banner that reads, "Do what you can, with what you have, where you are." Today, this would be called 'right sizing'. It simply means to understand what is the current context, what are the available resources, and what are the needs that can be reasonably met. This is important for communities, churches, families, and individuals but it is often avoided. It is avoided because it demands being brutally honest about oneself and one's context. We would much rather live in the past then face the harsh realities of the present. It would be wonderful to make things great again if we could just find a time when they were as great as we remember. Things can be great now if we accept what we have and where we are and do all that we can to make it great. There is greatness in being small, if it means that we can better take care of one another. There is greatness in being rural, if it means that we get to experience the beauty of God's good creation every day. There is a greatness in living now when people in need can get help and prayers by simply posting on Facebook or texting friends. While others talk about the worst in society, true joy and hope can be found by being all God has made us to be, with what God has given us, where God has placed us. If a program is done, it has to meet certain standards that cannot always be guaranteed by volunteers towards the end of VBS. Patti came up with a solution that provided a quality experience for the participants. While it did not reach an older audience, many of the older audience are seeking a different experience than traditional VBS. Which means their attendance drops towards the end of the week and their behavior reflects their disappointment. The Summer Bible Camp was a viable solution to do what we can, with what we have, where we are.

The activities of the ministerial alliance is also facing some adjustments. Since 2022, the active number of ministers in this community has been cut in half. There are just enough to cover the four weeks of Lenten lunch not counting Ash Wednesday and Spring Break. This has also put a strain on other activities. While the ministers of Sonora still work well together, there are simply to few of us available. This may mean being creative about what we do and how we do it. This is not about scarcity, but rather right sizing. God doesn't call us to do many things badly or do old things that no longer matter, but rather God is calling us to do. The few things we do to our utmost for His highest. We are here, after all, not to perform miracles but to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to a worn and weary world.

Some of the most precious memories people have is when their parents made the best of a bad situation. With the help of God's creative thinking, we can honor the past while doing it in a new and meaningful way. It begins with the question, "Why?" Why did they do it this way and what were they trying to accomplish? This moves to the question if what was trying to be accomplished is still needed today? If it is, then what new resources are available to meet that need. If not, what needs to be accomplished today and what tools have been given to meet that need. God assembles the right people at the right time with the right resources to meet the needs of God's people. If the needs are not being met, then what is needed is a new way of looking at the resources including the talents of people who may not look, think, or act like those in the past. As school starts, let us celebrate who we are and the people God has assembled to make this the best and greatest year ever!

Dariela Lopez - Toddler


Dari is married to JD Ozuna and they have one son,


